



John Wilkinson Nursery Admissions Policy

Shropshire Council Nursery Classes Admissions Policy has been adopted by the governing body. We aim to ensure that all access to the setting is open, fair and clearly communicated to the users of the Nursery setting.

From the term following their second birthday, some two year olds, depending on their family circumstances, are entitled to up to 570 hours of free early year's provision each year. To find out if your child is eligible see below. Places for 2 year olds cannot be guaranteed, as this is dependent upon spaces in the setting and staff ratio

Children who are 3 and 4 years of age also use the setting. From the term following their third birthday, all three and four year olds are eligible for the same 570 hours of free early provision per year regardless of their circumstances. The following table shows when their eligibility will begin.

If your child was born between...		He/She is eligible for Early Education from...
1 April and 31 August		Autumn term - after child's 3rd birthday
1 September and 31 December		Spring term - after child's 3rd birthday
1 January and 31 March		Summer term - after child's 3rd birthday

Working families are eligible for an additional 570 hours (1140 hours in total) of free provision each year. To qualify, a parent and their partner (or one parent in a lone parent family) must each expect to earn (on average) the equivalent of working 16 hours a week at the national minimum wage and be earning no more than £100,000. Availability of 30 hours is considered termly.

We will ensure we have a list of children whose parents have expressed a wish to attend the nursery.

As demand sometimes exceeds places available, we make decisions using the following priorities:

Children with a Statement of Special Educational Needs or EHCP which name a particular

setting will be allocated places if the LA deems the placement suitable. After this places are allocated according to an agreed set of criteria, in strict order of priority. They are as follows:

Priority 1: Looked after children and former looked after children (who are then adopted) as long as they have an eligible birthdate but who need not reside in the school's designated catchment area.

Priority 2: Children already attending the nursery setting who wish to change the sessions they are attending or increase their sessions if they are not taking their full entitlement.

Priority 3: Children living in the school's designated catchment area who have a sibling in the nursery or school and that sibling will be attending at the time the younger child starts nursery. If new places are limited, priority can be given to older children.

Priority 4: Children living in the school's designated catchment area without siblings at the nursery or school. If new places are limited, priority can be given to older children.

Priority 5: Children out of the school's catchment area with siblings in the nursery or school at the time the younger child starts nursery. If new places are limited, priority will be given to the children living closest to the nursery (distance from home to school measured as a straight line on a computerised mapping system).

Priority 6: Children out of the school's catchment area without a sibling in the nursery or school. If new places are limited, priority will be given to the children living closest to the nursery. (Distance from home to school measured as a straight line on a computerised mapping system).

Priority 7: If the school governors have decided to offer extra fee paying hours to children attending for their 15 free hours, this offer can only be made once all parental requests for free places have been dealt with and places should not be given in situations that will prohibit a child from getting their free entitlement. The charges for these extra hours should be set at a reasonable market rate and not be seen to undercut any other provision in the area.

We are an equal opportunities setting and our admissions process considers children independently of gender, background, religion, ethnicity or competence in speaking English.

Attendance and entitlement

15 hours per week for 38 weeks

Or

570 hours divided by number of weeks we are open in the given year

Or

Either of the two options above with "top up" payments made by parents.

Governors will consider 30 hours but we keep this under review.

Places available to 2 year olds may, if necessary, be limited to 4 pupils but this will be determined by the settings capacity to maintain ratios. We may prioritise older 2's if we have high demand. 2 year olds may be eligible for "24U" funding. (See below)

Please note that it is not permissible for any school to guarantee a place the Reception class as a result of a child attending the nursery. Primary school admissions are regulated and administered through the LA.

Other information

Prior to starting in the setting members of the Nursery staff will contact you and offer to make a **home visits**. This allows you to meet in a relaxed and familiar environment and gives you an opportunity to share any information which you think will help your child to settle into the Nursery. We also give you any information which would be helpful to you and explain routines and policies such as our medicines policy.

A **daily attendance register** is completed and if your child is absent the staff will give you a call to confirm the reasons for absence so we can safeguard children , monitor illnesses and inform other parents if necessary to keep an eye out for symptoms e.g. chickenpox.

We have a very strict policy regarding children being released to appropriate adults which is detailed in the prospectus.

Data

Information we are required to **keep on record** is as follows:

1. Full name, address and telephone numbers
2. Information regarding legal contact and parental responsibility
3. Contact details for parents and carers including place of work
4. Emergency details
5. Child's date of birth
6. Records of medical need and dietary requirements
7. Details of family doctor
8. Collection details

We **will submit** the following information to the local authority for free entitlement as part of the early year's census:

1. Full name
2. Date of birth

3. Address
4. Gender
5. Ethnicity (This data will be collected on a voluntary basis)
6. Special educational needs status
7. Funded hours taken during census
8. Total number of hours

Is my child entitled to this free Early Years education?

When is my child eligible?

If you meet the criteria you are entitled to the free place from the term following your child's second birthday:

- if your child was born between 1 January and 31 March you are entitled to the place from the summer term (after Easter)
- if your child was born between 1 April and 31 August you are entitled to the place from the autumn term (September)
- if your child was born between 1 September and 31 December you are entitled to the place from the spring term (January)
